DEGREE OPTIONS

Well-trained professionals from a variety of backgrounds are essential for the best possible response to emergencies that occur in all areas of life. To ensure public safety, Northampton Community College offers four distinct Emergency Services training programs to prepare participants to plan for, manage, and respond to natural or human-made emergencies and disasters. Our programs feature online and classroom training options – making them ideal for current professionals and those looking to enter the field.

EMERGENCY SERVICES TECHNOLOGY A.A.S. DEGREE

This two-year associate program lets you specialize in the field of your choice such as firefighting, search and rescue, EMT, and training. Core courses cover basic emergency response and decision making, while electives cover more in-depth topics.

EMERGENCY SERVICES SPECIALIST DIPLOMA

As a one-year program, the emergency services specialist diploma is a concentrated version of the A.A.S. degree, allowing you to enter the job market at a faster rate. Similar to the associate program, the specialist diploma lets you choose electives based on your professional interests to pursue roles as an EMT, firefighter, or other front-line emergency responder. You can also further your studies at the associate or bachelor level.

EMERGENCY SERVICES ADMINISTRATION A.A.S. DEGREE

The two-year emergency services administration associate program prepares you for a variety of emergency administration and planning roles. It's an ideal degree if you're an established first responder looking to advance

your career or if you're dedicated to ensuring public safety. The program teaches you necessary skills to coordinate response efforts in a natural or human-made emergency. Since it's typical for multiple agencies to work together, communicate goals, and deploy resources with efficiency, you will be prepared with well-rounded training.

EMERGENCY MEDICAL TECHNICIAN SPECIALIST DIPLOMA

This specialized, one-year program includes our 6-credit EMT course. After finishing this specialization, students may apply their courses toward an associate degree.

PHILIPS FAMILY FIRE TECHNOLOGY SCHOLARSHIP IN MEMORY OF BOB PHILIPS

BACKGROUND

Five generations of the Philips and Marsh families have served in the Stroudsburg Fire Department. Bob served over 72 years as a firefighter in Stroudsburg. Robert "Sandy" Philips, son of Bob Philips, created this scholarship to memorialize his father's service to the community and to Monroe County. Sandy earned an Associate in Arts degree in general education and an Associate in Applied Science degree in fire technology from NCC.

SCHOLARSHIP ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- Students who are majoring in Emergency Services Technology, Fire Technology tract
- First preference is given to a resident of Monroe County who is an active volunteer firefighter
- Second preference is given to a resident of Northampton County who is an active volunteer firefighter
- If there are no applicants who meet the first or second preference, the scholarship will be awarded to students majoring in Emergency Services Technology, Fire Technology tract

SEAN CAMERON MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP ENDOWMENT

BACKGROUND

This scholarship was established by Bob and Cathy Cameron to honor the memory of their son, Sean Cameron, a Notre Dame High School student, soccer player, and member of the Forks Township Junior Firefighter program. The award supports Northampton Community College students who aspire to careers in emergency services.

SCHOLARSHIP ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- This scholarship is open to any Northampton Community College student majoring in emergency services
- Preference shall be given to graduates of Easton, Nazareth, Notre Dame (Green Pond), Wilson, Pen Argyl, Bangor, Pius X, and CIT high schools

THE GUY TOMAINO MEMORIAL FIREFIGHTERS ENDOWMENT BACKGROUND

Guy B. Tomaino dedicated the major part of his life to helping other people. Guy joined the Wilson Fire Department in 1956 at the age of 30. In 1966, after having served the community as an assistant fire chief for several years, he was named chief. Chief Tomaino also found the time to study fire technology at NCC and received an associate degree in fire technology from the college in 1975. Because of his tireless service to the community and his commitment to firefighting as a career, The Guy Tomaino Memorial Firefighters Endowment was established to honor his memory.

SCHOLARSHIP ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- To provide scholarship money sufficient enough to underwrite a part-time student for up to four courses in fire technology (or related courses in the degree program) each academic year.

1. Apply To NCC
